Epiphany of the Lord Monday 6th January

'The Epiphany is the manifestation of Jesus as Messiah of Israel, Son of God and Saviour of the world. The great feast of Epiphany celebrates the adoration of Jesus by the wise men (magi) from the East, together with his Baptism in the Jordan and the wedding feast of Cana in Galilee. In the magi, representatives of the neighboring pagan religions, the Gospel sees the first-fruits of the nations, who welcome the good news of salvation through the Incarnation'.

Planning your Wedding

It is important to give three months notice of your intention to marry it is common practice for a couple to book the church a long time in advance. So it is important to contact the Parish Office to make sure the Church and Priest is available on the day you require.

Church Requirements: Church
Law requires three months notice
of your intention to marry. It is
strongly recommended that
couples preparing for marriage
complete a pre-marriage course.

Civil Requirements: When the couple have chosen the date, Church and Priest for their marriage (and confirmed these matters with the relevant Priest) they will then need to make an appointment to meet with any Civil Registrar in person to give notice of their intention to marry. This meeting with the Registrar must take place at least three months before the wedding in order to comply with the civil Requirements. What is Family Offering?

Family Offering Donations are the core source of Income for the Parish, and they are a separate and different offering to those collected during Mass.

Why are Family Offerings so important?

Family Offering Donations support the work that the Parish do. They allow the Parish to function effectively, and continue to provide ministries and services to the community.

What are Family Offering donations used for?

Parish Family Offerings are the primary source of income for the Parish used to cover the day to day operational costs of the Church. The regular family offering contribution covers costs such as light and heat, Insurance, maintenance of the Church and liturgical supplies.

It is important to note that the Family Offering Donation **stays within the Parish**. They do not get passed on to the Dioceses for distribution among other Parishes.
