The Advent Wreath

The Advent wreath tradition involves four candles around the ever-green wreath. A new candle is lit on each of the four Sundays



before Christmas. Each candle represents something different, the first, second and fourth candles are purple; the third candle is rose-coloured. The first candle symbolizes **hope** and is called the "Prophet's Candle" The prophets of the Old Testament, especially Isaiah, waited in hope for the Messiah's arrival.
