### The Solemnity of CORPUS CHRISTI

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, historically known by its Latin name, **Corpus Christi**, celebrates the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist—Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. Since the year 1264, the Catholic Church has celebrated the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. The Council of Trent (1545-1563) solemnly defined that in the Most



Blessed Sacrament of the Eucharist "the body and blood together with the soul and divinity of our Lord Jesus Christ, and therefore the whole Christ, are truly, and substantially contained." On Corpus Christi, the whole Church publicly confesses Christ's words: 'I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world.' (Jn 6:51).

### Arklow Sports Hub


Wicklow Sports & Recreation Partnership has launched Arklow Sports Hub at Coral Leisure Centre in Arklow. The Hub, which was launched last Wednesday May 26th,
