Gaudete Sunday

The third Sunday of Advent is also called Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete is a Latin word that means "rejoice." This name is taken from the entrance antiphon for Sunday's Mass, which is also echoed in today's second reading from the Paul's letter to the Philippians. We mark this Sunday by wearing a pink Vestment and lighting a pink candle instead of a purple one on the Advent wreath. It is a reminder that the Advent season is a season of joy because our salvation is already at hand.

Third Week [Pink Candle] • Lord God, may we, your people, who look forward to the birthday of Christ experience the joy of salvation and celebrate that feast with love and thanksgiving. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen

The Slow track to Bethlehem

When do you put up your crib? There are different family traditions. What about Gaudete Sunday, 12 December 2021. On this Sunday the rose or pink candle is lit in the advent wreath. The figure of the baby Jesus will have been blessed at Mass that morning and hidden in the house. Set up the crib structure with the 'expectant' straw in it but no figures. Station the figures around the house in order of their appearance – kings coming last. Gradually move them nearer to the empty crib.



On Christmas Eve morning put in Mary, Joseph and the animals. Young family members will search for the figure of Jesus. In the night, the Baby Jesus is placed between the loving gaze of Mary and Joseph with angels and shepherds making their timely appearance. The journey to Bethlehem has many stages. If you stay with the silent movement of the figures as you journey with them you might find that they come alive in your heart.
