To all who participate in parish life and ministry,

A year after my installation as Archbishop, I am presenting a Statement of Mission for the Dublin Archdiocese. This Statement highlights our core mission in a time of rapid change, setting out a vision for the diocese and providing values to inform our planning for the future.

This is the beginning of our more formal response to the Building Hope Task Force Report which is available on the diocesan website: Task Force | Archdiocese of Dublin (dublindiocese.ie). Having gathered 3,000 consultation responses from people, priests and parishes, the Task Force in its Report set out a pastoral strategy for the Archdiocese. I would ask you all to read it carefully and reflectively. It is an essential starting point in the process of renewal we must undertake together.

I am inviting Parish Pastoral Councils to give priority to the implementation of the mission, vision and values described in the Statement of Mission. I am asking all priests, deacons, parish pastoral workers and parish employees to engage wholeheartedly in planning for the future.

I have appointed a Pastoral Strategy Implementation Group to oversee the implementation of the Task Force strategy. The group will in due course provide a framework and resources to help faith communities engage creatively with this important work.

As the year progresses, parishes will be invited to participate in a process of discernment about parish life into the future. Further details will be provided in late March, for active consideration between Easter and Pentecost. This process will follow on from and build on the synodal conversations taking place in Lent, preparations for which are already well underway in the Archdiocese.

Led by the Holy Spirit, we can respond imaginatively, practically, and with Christian hope to the needs of our time and bring life and energy to the renewal we are called to in Christ.

Background on the Gospel Reading

Last Sunday we heard Jesus call Peter to be his disciple. Jesus then travels with Peter and the other disciples. Luke reports acts of healing (a person with leprosy and a paralytic man) and the call of Levi, the tax collector. Jesus also replies to questions from the Pharisees regarding fasting and the observance of the Sabbath. In the verses immediately before today's gospel reading, Jesus is reported to have chosen 12 men from among his disciples to be apostles. Apostle is a Greek word that means "one who is ties in their relationships, currently online or by phone. sent."

When spoken from the mountaintop in Matthew's Gospel, we can't miss the impression that Jesus is speaking with the authority and voice of God. The mountaintop is a symbol of closeness to God. Those who ascend the mountain see God and speak for God; recall the story of Moses and the Ten Commandments. As Luke introduces the location of Jesus' teaching, Jesus teaches on level ground, alongside the disciples and the crowd. Luke presents Jesus' authority in a different light. He is God among us.

As we listen to this Gospel, the Beatitudes jar our sensibilities. Those who are poor, hungry, weeping, or persecuted are called blessed. This is, indeed, a Gospel of reversals. Those often thought to have been forgotten by God are called blessed.


