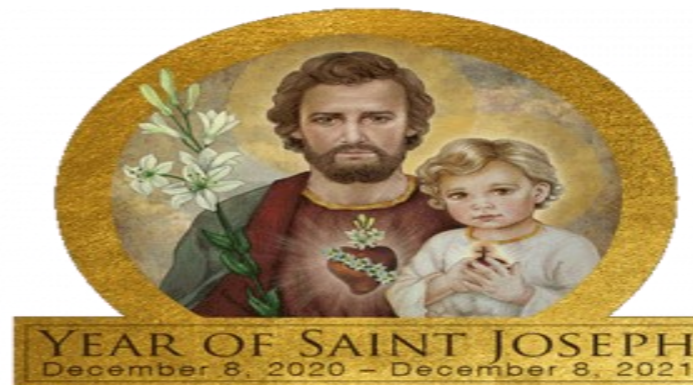

Public Transport

Public transport capacity is scheduled to increase to 75% from Monday 19th July 2021 which will provide additional capacity on each service along the Wicklow/Dublin corridor. Current capacity limits are set at 50% which were put in place for buses, trains and trams during the pandemic. Bus Eireann have confirmed they will be implementing these changes, and this should alleviate some of the pressure at peak times.



POPE FRANCIS HOME FROM HOSPITAL

The Holy Father was discharged from Hospital last Wednesday morning. Before returning to the Vatican, the Pope went to the Basilica of Saint Mary Major where, before the icon of the Virgin Mary Salus Populi Romani, he expressed his gratitude for the success of his surgery and offered a prayer for all the sick, especially those he had met during his stay in hospital. Shortly before midday he returned to Casa Santa Marta.

ON REFLECTION

In today's Gospel, we hear the Twelve referred to as "apostles." The word *apostle* is a Greek word meaning "one who is sent."
