In the readings today there is a great consciousness of our sinfulness, as we pray 'Haver mercy on us O Lord, for we have sinned'. There is also a sense that the time to repent and turn back is now. These three strands of Lenten observance are as ancient as Christianity itself. There is no substitute for them. 'Fasting is the soul of prayer, mercy is the lifeblood of fasting. If we have not all three together, we have nothing.' says St Peter Chrysologus
