Monsignor Colm Gallagher

(1932-2021)

. A. Tribute

It was with great sadness that we heard of the death of Monsignor Colm Gallagher last weekend. Monsignor Colm was born on 15th August 1932 on the feast of the Assumption. The youngest of four children, he was very close to his siblings and his parents, particularly his mother and his sister Bríd. Following his education in Belvedere College where he was very involved in rugby and played on the Junior and Senior Rugby Cup teams, he studied Irish and Philosophy in U.C.D. Growing up on Clonliffe Road in Drumcondra, Clonliffe College was his obvious choice when choosing a seminary and there he studied theology for four years which resulted in his ordination in 1957 at the age of 25.

As a young priest his first posting was to Peamount Sanitorium, a hospital specialising in TB, which was still very prevalent at the time. He remained there for three years and was moved to Ballyfermot in 1960. In 1963 he moved to Newtownmountkennedy, where he remained for 7 years. He spent the next five years in Donnycarney before being made Parish Priest in Killinarden where he was sent to develop the parish, build schools and build the community. At the age of 51, when the Fr Colm Gallagher arrived in Arklow Parish, he was a relatively young Parish Priest, and he was a Parish Priest with a purpose. The experience and knowledge he had gathered in his previous parishes gave him a huge ambition and passion for the work he faced within the strong, established community of Arklow Parish.

Fr Gallagher brought his financial expertise, huge enthusiasm, and boundless energy, and proceeded to build upon the involvement in the already busy parish and made it one of the most forwardthinking parishes in the diocese. He had a true gift to see what jobs needed to be done and exactly the right persons to get to volunteer for those projects. Many of us have had the phone call to get us on board, to give happily of our various gifts and were encouraged to participate more at parish level. He tirelessly gave 100% of his time for the greater good of the people of Arklow and expected no less from his volunteers.

Monsignor Gallagher was a humble man. He may not have given this impression but in fact he did everything, not for his own benefit. but for the benefit of our parish. When he was elevated to Monsignor, he was surprised and honoured but insisted that it was more a tribute to the people of Arklow than it was to him.

When retiring to Raheny Parish after 24 years with us here in Arklow he was torn between leaving the parish he loved and being close to his family in Dublin. Although it has been 13 years since he has left us, he always enquired about the people of the parish. He remembered everyone and was still interested in their lives and families. Only last week, in his final days, he said he was praying for us all and asked that we pray for him. At his farewell celebration speech in 2008, he said that he regarded the people of Arklow as his family, saying, "Partings are difficult, especially with family, and I consider you as family. Sadly, my days with you are numbered. I thank you from the bottom of my heart for the support you have given me in my years in Arklow."

Rest in Peace Fr. G. You will be greatly missed.
