First Reading: Ezra publicly proclaims the law before the assembled nation. The people are so moved by the proclamation of God's law, that they throw themselves to the ground and weep, but Ezra encourages them to rejoice. Receiving the Word of God is always a joyful occasion.

Second Reading: The old nation consisted of individual Jews who formed a national community but now the church consists of interrelated members within the Body of Christ. There are no longer individuals, but parts of the one Body, so that the Body of Christ is indivisible. Each member has an individual task which is not for oneself, rather or the whole Church.

Gospel Reading: Jesus proclaims the words of Isaiah in the synagogue of his hometown and applies them to himself, words which sound blasphemous to his hearers. He steps out of the obscurity of his boyhood in Nazareth and into his public role of Messiah.
