**POPE ESTABLISHES WORLD DAY FOR GRANDPARENTS AND ELDERLY**



Pope Francis has announced the institution of a World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, which will take place each year on the fourth Sunday in July, close to the feast of Sts Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of Jesus.

Recalling the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple – when the elderly Simeon and Anna encountered the child Jesus and recognized Him as the Messiah – Pope Francis said, “the Holy Spirit even today stirs up thoughts and words of wisdom in the elderly.” The voice of the elderly “is precious,” he said, “because it sings the praises of God and preserves the roots of the peoples.”

The elderly, he continued, “remind us that old age is a gift and that grandparents are the link between the different generation, to pass on to the young the experience of life.” Pope Francis has chosen the theme, “I am with you always” from the Gospel of St Matthew as the message for the 1st World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly on July 25th 2021.


