Trinity Sunday, officially called "The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity," is one of the few celebrations of the Christian Year that commemorates a reality and doctrine rather than a person or event. On Trinity Sunday, Christians remember and honour the eternal God: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Trinity Sunday is celebrated the Sunday after Pentecost. Eastern Churches have no tradition of Trinity Sunday, arguing that they celebrate the Trinity every Sunday. We also commemorate the Trinity at every Eucharist, although we set aside a special feast day for the purpose as well!
