

**Fundraising Talk** 

There will be a fundraising talk for the Remembering Archbishop Edward Project on Tues 10th May at 8pm in Árus Lorcáin. Speaker is Historian Pat Power and the topic will be Archbishop Daniel Murray from Sheepwalk.

Edward Byrne was Archbishop of Dublin from 1921-1940. He was the son of a tenant farmer from

Kilahurler and a member of the O'Byrne clan, a celtic clan synonymous with Co. Wicklow's heritage. Commencing his role as Archbishop of Dublin in 1921, Edward made an immense contribution to the newly formed Irish state. The government of the day had no money for education, health or social care. In his

position as Archbishop, Edward

used church funding to support the

cash strapped state by; Funding the establishment of schools in all parishes in his diocese, He fostered the establishment of health clinics throughout the diocese.

He was responsible for the expansion of Dublin's public hospitals including the National Children's hospital in Crumlin and the establishment of St Vincent's in Elm Park.

In an era which was without social welfare support Archbishop The Women of Faith Conference 2022 is LIVE on Radio Maria

Byrne was a staunch advocate of organisations like St Vincent De Paul and the Legion of Mary in their charitable works for Dublin's poor and homeless.
