Pope Francis: I am close to the Australian people

At the General Audience on Wednesday, Pope Francis calls for prayers for Australia, which is battling massive wildfires.

Pope Francis asked for everyone "to pray to the Lord to help the people [of Australia] in this difficult time" as major fires rage across the nation. Addressing Australian speaking pilgrims at the General Audience, the Holy Father said "I am close to the Australian people".

Major bushfires have broken out around Australia, with more than 10.3 million hectares (25.5 million acres) of land burned in recent weeks. More than twenty people have lost their lives in the fires.
