The Season of Creation, is marked throughout the Christian world from 1st September to 4th October the Feast of

Saint Francis of Assisi and celebrates the joy of creation as well as encouraging awareness-raising initiatives to protect the natural environment. Pope Francis established 1st September as an annual World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation. The theme for the Season of Creation 2021 is 'Restoring Our Common Home'. During this season we are asked to join together to celebrate creation and protect our common home (our world) through prayer, reflection and action. The global Christian family is called to awaken to the urgent need to heal our relationships with creation and with each other and to encourage our parish communities to do the same. Pope Francis will attend the **United** Nations Climate Change Conference (COP26) in **Glasgow in November**. Scotland's Bishops confirmed the Pope's presence among other world leaders in a statement on their website.

SACRAMENTS ARE PUBLIC EXPRESSIONS OF FAITH

Sacraments are not just private events concerning individuals. Yes! they concern individual people but they are always expressions of the parish faith community. There is no such thing as a "private" Baptism. Baptism is the welcoming of a new Christian into the parish community. There is no such thing as a "private" Mass. Mass is always a community expression of faith. There is no such thing as a "private" funeral. A funeral always involves the loss of a member of the parish community which mourns their loss. The family may wish to have their house private for different reasons but the funeral Mass is where the parish community commends the deceased to God. Sometimes people attending a funeral leave before the final prayers for the dead person. What message does that give? That their schedule doesn't allow them to give the deceased the respect of staying until their remains have left the church. How we treat the dead says a lot about how we treat the living.

Archbishop Dermot Farrell, gave this homily on Friday 3rd September, for the Centenary of the Legion of Mary in the Church of Saint Nicholas of Myra, Francis Street, Dublin.

I am delighted to celebrate this Mass to mark the centenary of the foundation of the Legion of Mary, here in Dublin, by Frank Duff. Little was it realised at the time that the small group that he founded would spread its wings all over the world. The Legion of Mary grew out of the Saint Vincent de Paul Society. Frank Duff saw the need within the need. His vision was to offer concrete ways for Catholic lay people to live out the gospel of Jesus, its call and its mission in the contemporary world, supported by prayer, friendship, trusting in the power of the Holy Spirit, under the patronage and protection of the Mary, who herself had been so open to the message of the angel, that Word who took flesh in her. Of course, Frank Duff saw that this could not happen in a vacuum. Consequently, the purpose of the Legion of Mary is twofold: the spiritual growth and development of its members, and the witness to and service of the kingdom of God.
