Monday 15th August The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary -Mass in Arklow at 10am & 7pm Johnstown 10am Castletown 8pm

The Assumption of Mary: honours the fullness of blessedness that was her destiny, the glorification of her immaculate soul and virginal body that completely conformed her to the risen Christ. This is a celebration that offers to the Church and to all humanity on exemplar and a consoling message, teaching us the fulfilment of our highest hopes. Their own future glorification is happily in store for all those whom Christ has made his own brothers and sisters by taking on their flesh and blood.

Wednesday 17th August The story of Knock: began on the 21st August 1879 when Our Lady, St Joseph and St John the Evangelist appeared at the south gable of Knock Parish Church. This miraculous apparition was witnessed by fifteen people, young and old. Knock is an internationally recognised Marian Shrine. St John Paul II visited knock as part of his 1979 papal pilgrimage to Ireland. Pope Francis went to Knock and Saturday 20th August prayed at the Shrine before the final Mass of the World Meeting of Families at the Phoenix Park, Dublin, On Sunday, 26th August 2018. The date of the memorial is within the annual novena conducted at the Shrine. Pope Francis, on the Feast of St Joseph, 19th March 2021, declared Knock to be an International Shrine of Eucharistic and Marian Devotion.
